

Criteria for the certification of interiors

Interiors are for example:

- hotel room
- office space
- practice rooms
- apartments
- rooms in a boarding school or home

The following is checked:

- There is a quality management system in place which, among other things, records the responsibilities of all employees and ensures that these responsibilities are monitored and adhered to, as well as a concept for training and further education on the subject of allergies and intolerances.
- The corresponding room is a non-smoking room.
- The rooms have smooth floor coverings (e.g. parquet, linoleum, stone or short pile synthetic fibre carpets).
- Pollen grids are mounted on the windows or the room is air-conditioned.
- Pets have no access to such rooms.

The entire object does not have to meet the requirements, but at least one room (e.g. a hotel room, an office).

For hotel rooms the following additional criteria apply:

- Mite-proof mattress covers, duvet and pillow covers are provided.
- Hypoallergenic soaps, shower gels and shampoos are provided (see criteria for cosmetics).
- No textile furniture and curtains are used.
- Cleaning is carried out with hypoallergenic detergents and vacuum cleaners (see criteria for chemical and technical products).

Certified interiors and hotel rooms are:

- allergy-friendly.

The Allergy Seal of Quality refers exclusively to allergies and intolerances. The owner or manager determines the needs for which he wants to certify the property and has this checked by Service Allergie Suisse SA. Those affected will then find this information in the guest information at hotels or in the description of the property.
